We are excited to announce that 2024 marks our 50th anniversary since incorporation!

In 1969, when the Pierre Elliot Trudeau government amended the criminal code to legalize "therapeutic abortion" in some

circumstances, life in Canada changed dramatically. The fight to protect the unborn began and a culture war that has divided Canadians ever since, was launched.

Many Canadians who understood that life in the womb is sacred, mobilized to push back and educate their peers on the issue of abortion. In the two decades that followed, many grassroots pro-life organizations were established including Halton Pro-life (now Halton Alive). On October 18, 1974, Halton Pro-

life was formally incorporated and given charitable status.

The early founders, employees, board members, and volunteers worked hard to expose the truth about abortion and educate the Halton community. Several years later, on January 28, 1988, the Supreme Court of Canada, decriminalized abortion in the R. v Morgentaler decision.

Canada has remained without a law on abortion ever since and so we continue to push back on this issue. It hasn't taken long before the culture of death to expand to the born, and now we fight a battle for life on both ends, facing abortion and assisted suicide through MAiD (Medical Assistance

in Dying).

Halton Pro-life/Halton Alive has been on the forefront of these issues, educating, organizing, and mentoring new generations of pro-life advocates. Today we continue, standing on a foundation of dedicated, passionate individuals. We look forward to honouring those who paved the way and the hope we have for the future

On exactly fifty years to the day, October 18, 2024, we will host a special



THE LATEST DATA ON MAID IN CANADA AND HALTON


The total number of medically assisted deaths reported in Canada since the introduction of Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID) legislation in 2016 is 44,958 (as of 2022). Alex Schadenberg of Euthanasia Prevention Coalition estimates we may have reached as many as 60,000 by the end of 2023.

Canada's legalization of MAiD in 2016 was a pivotal moment, marking a significant shift in societal attitudes towards end-of-life care. Since then, we have seen the rapid expansion of this program in our country. So rapid, in fact, that we have outpaced all other countries, worldwide, to become the fastest growing adopter of this program, in history. The Netherlands, where assisted death has been legal for more than two decades, has the highest global physician-assisted death rate at 5.1%. As of 2022, MAiD accounts for 4.1% of all deaths in Canada.

Canada intends to expand MAiD eligibility to people on the basis of mental health, however, in January 2024, Canada's Health Minister, Mark Holland, introduced a bill that would delay the implementation of assisted suicide for mental illness until March, 2027. The delay is based on "system readiness" to "get it right", not a hesitation on the ethics or morality of the expansion.

Federal data on MAiD for 2023 is not yet available, however the Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario has released 2023 data showing that to date, there have been 18,373 MAiD deaths in Ontario, 4,641 in 2023 alone. A further breakdown of the data for the month of December 2023 indicates that 19 MAiD deaths occurred in Halton Region.

The data in this article is taken from the Fourth Annual Report on Medical Assistance in Dying released by the Government of Canada and the December 2023 data released from the Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario.
